Entry Door Buyer's Guide



Entry doors provide a number of important functions for your home. Because of this, the doors you use on the exterior of your home need to be more carefully considered than doors elsewhere in your home. Unlike other doors in your home, entry doors need to have everything: security, aesthetics, energy efficiency and function. The purpose of this guide is to serve as an entry door buyer's guide for anyone looking to upgrade the look of their home.

I) What Are The Different Types Of Exterior Doors?

There are three main types of exterior doors. These include a solid door, which is commonly used as an entryway door. There are also screen doors, which can be placed in front of a solid entryway door or in front of a sliding glass door elsewhere on the exterior. Some screen doors can stand on their own - these have screened sections with a glass pane that slides to close or open the screen to the outside.

Finally, there are sliding glass doors that are commonly used for patios. All doors can come in a variety of styles, such as French doors, which are popular choices for exterior patios. Doors leading to garages can have a hybrid of interior and exterior door features. They are usually solid panel doors.

II) What Are They Made Out Of & The Pros & Cons Of Each



There are a number of different materials that exterior doors can be made from. Each have their advantages and disadvantages, which will be outlined below.

Wood: Wood offers a high-end look to your home and can be ornately carved into all sorts of unique designs. The downside is that they are more expensive. They also require more maintenance than other types of materials in order to retain their look.

Steel: Steel is a very popular choice for an exterior door material. In fact, steel doors represent roughly half the market. Steel is reasonably priced and offers good security. It is also energy efficient and doesn't require much maintenance. However, dents can be hard to repair and steel doesn't hold up as well against weather.

Fiberglass: Fiberglass doors are better at resisting wear and tear than doors made from steel are. They can come in a variety of looks, including a smooth surface or even an embossed wood texture. They can be painted just about any color. Fiberglass doors are much more likely to crack upon sustaining a major impact, however.

Sliding Glass Doors: These doors are made from glass and slide to the side instead of utilizing hinges. They are commonly used as back doors and almost never as front doors. They allow you to see outside better but are less secure.


Screen Doors: Screen doors allow better air circulation throughout your home in the warmer months. The big disadvantage of screen doors is the lack of security. Screen doors can be used as a part of your entryway door, although they will need a stronger, more secure door behind them.

Doors can also be made from a mixture of the above materials. For example, many entry doors include decorative glass, or allow it to be added. You can consider different combinations when finding the right door for your home.



III) What's The BEST Type Of Door For Your Home





The best type of door for your house depends on a number of different factors. For example, what color or material fits the best with the existing color of your home? Or are you planning to redo the exterior of your house, repaint it a different color or otherwise change its appearance? You should take into account the overall look of your home - or what you want that overall look to be - when deciding on any exterior door.

Another factor that can determine what kind of door you should get is where you live. For example, if you live in a hurricane-prone area, you will want doors that can withstand the high impact of debris slamming into them during a storm. In some areas, hurricane-safe doors and windows are part of building codes. These doors can be reinforced with steel, feature impact-resistant glass and have aluminum frames.

Another good example is wildfire-prone areas. Areas like California commonly experience wildfires, and exterior doors that can shield your home from the blaze are a smart investment. If you live in a flood-prone area, you should also take that into consideration when shopping for entryway doors. Some models provide greater resistance to water infiltration.

IV) Why Would You Want A New Door?



It might be time to upgrade your door if you are noticing the following:

The door is old: If the door is old and worn, it may need replacing. Signs that the door is worn enough to not be providing its intended function include gaps between the frame and the door itself, a noticeable draft or obvious warping or cracking. Do note that gaps between the door and the frame could also indicate foundation issues in your home, so if your house appears to be slanted it would be best to get a professional to analyze it.

You are redoing your house: Whether you are repainting your shutters or redoing the siding on your home, it may be best to get a new door at the same time as well. An older door that hasn't been updated may take away from the look you are trying to achieve.

You are about to move: Curb appeal is incredibly important when selling your home, and redoing the entrance to your home is one of the most effective changes you can make so the home will be more attractive to buyers.
